group (Race, Ethnicity, Political Beliefs, Religious Beliefs, Physical Abilities, Age, Gender, Skill Level & Other Ideologies)

- You have thought about speaking at Meetups or WordCamps but haven't been able to think of a topic
- You think you don't know anything worth speaking about

So why should we get more females on board?

- Marginalization is dangerous
- Females voices are non-negotiable! Every human has one and should be allowed to use it positively!

Getting females on board is never about which gender is better.

It's about balance, representation and the future of the world!

How we can encourage and create a welcoming & balanced environment for females to show up!

First, we need to remind ourselves that the WordPress community embodies the Open Source Spirit and there are so many ways one can **get involved** with **WordPress**.

Core, Design, Mobile, Accessibility, Support, Polyglots, Themes, Documentation, Plugins, Community, Meta, Training, Test, TV, Marketing, Hosting, CLI, Tide. (See

[Make.WordPress.org](https://make.wordpress.org) for detailed information!) Then, we need to affirm that Tech is not for a certain group of people, it is for everyone!


Are we saying we do not know any female who is good in any of these fields?

Getting females on stage - so what do we do??

- Make our community a sanctuary where women and girls can speak up and not get laughed at or shut down!
- Don't be a jerk, be humane, kind and deliberate about being welcoming, be conscious of that as a FACT!.
- Bring your sister, wife, girlfriend, mother to the next meetup event.
- Be deliberate about your approach as community members and organisers. As humans, shouldn't we strive to grow together?
